
From the Desk of Mr. Poole

HONOR A VETERAN DRESS DOWN DAY

We have an opportunity to lend a hand to someone in great need. A dear friend of Epiphany and retired parishioner at Precious Blood is joining together with a group of fellow veterans to help build a house for an injured soldier. She was an Army medic who, while in the line of duty during a sling load operation, was injured when the cable beneath the helicopter snapped and dropped the load on top of her. Her injuries included a crushed spine, head trauma, and two torn shoulders. She is now a partial quadriplegic with only limited use of her left hand.

This soldier has been declared 100% disabled by the Veteran's Administration. She receives nothing in the way of retirement benefits from the Army because she had only 17 years of active service. She also has no family. However, a SMART HOUSE will have all of the adaptations needed for her to become almost totally independent.



On Tuesday, May 22, Epiphany, through the SCA, will partner the group Villagers for Veterans to raise funds for this effort. We will have a Dress Down Day and we ask each student to bring in AT LEAST \$1.00. If families would like to donate a larger amount, be assured that every penny will go toward helping this hero. Donations will be accepted through May 31.

STUDENTS 'UNDER THE WEATHER'?

Perhaps not so much the weather, but the fact that everything is in bloom has many of our students feeling unwell. Even though allergy symptoms make a child feel ill, they not contagious or considered 'sick'. Many suffer from sinus stuffiness and drainage, resulting in sore throats and nausea. Other students have terribly red and itchy eyes. Others still have skin contact allergies.

With that said, we ask parents to please do whatever they can to make their children comfortable during the school day. We are going into the last quarter of the school year, with standardized testing and a lot of great activities as we wrap up the school year. It is important that students only miss school due to actual illness. As for allergies, many medication options are available, from nasal sprays, decongestants, eye drops and skin creams, so please discuss with your doctor or pharmacist as necessary. If over the counter medication needs to be sent to the office (including cough drops), send it in with a completed Authorization to Administer Medication Form (please follow all instructions on page 2 of that form) and the medication in the original container. The container must have dosage information and an expiration date.

We also ask parents to notify the teacher and the office if their child has been medicated, the reason why (be specific), the medication given, and the time it was administered.
